



Decoding COP26





What is the COP?

The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), holds an annual summit for governments, known as a <u>Conference of the Parties (COP)</u>. The COP is attended by national representatives (often Ministers or Heads of States, and professional negotiators), observer organizations including private sector, NGOs and representatives from civil society.

What is the COP?

- The COP is the supreme decision-making body of the Convention.
- All states that are party (Parties) to the Convention are represented in the COP.
- During the annual summit, Parties negotiate a series of legal texts (the 'Convention' and other legal instruments) with decisions to be adopted by the COP.

Since COP1, participation at UNFCCC COPs has grown from **3000 to over 20,000** participants from all over the world.

















Why is COP26 so important?


- Global emissions are at an all-time high and none of the key countries are on track to meet their obligations under the Paris Agreement.
- Scientifically and politically, 2021 is being described as humankind's "last chance" to take meaningful action to tackle climate change.
- By COP26, countries are expected to submit updated NDCs in line with the Paris Agreement. We must keep average global warming to within 1.5 degrees if we are to avoid the worst effects of climate change.
- COP26 will be the biggest international summit the UK has ever hosted; expected to convene over 30,000 delegates including Heads of State, climate experts and negotiators, business and NGO representatives and campaigners.



Week 2: Subject to change

High-Level Segment: Systems Transformation & policy certainty delivered

- Key issues and sticking points unpicked in the negotiations and around sectoral issues such as energy, transport, resilience.
- Sectoral breakthroughs/ tipping points achieved in multiple sectors of the global economy (response to COUNTDOWN call to action)

Nature & resilience —protecting nature that protects health, homes and livelihoods:

- All countries and NSAs unite around near-term ambition; net zero becomes a 2030 concern i.e. net zero by 2050 is fine but only meaningful if you have a 2030 goal.
- Countries definitively move away from fossil fuels.
- Springboard to era of implementation and, ultimately, the 2023 Global Stock take (where the world will assess progress made towards Paris targets)

The Venue: Glasgow - Scottish Event Campus (SEC)

The SEC features:

- **1. The SEC Centre:** five interconnected exhibition and meeting spaces.
- **2.** The SEC Armadillo: a 3000-seat auditorium.
- **3. The SSE Hydro:** a 14,300-capacity concert, sporting and special events arena.

Blue Zone - Green Zone

The official UNFCCC **COP venue** is split into a **two main zones**:

- Blue zone: is designated for the UN conference and negotiations by official delegates of the participating nations and observers with accredited badges.
- **Green zone:** is open to the general public, with parallel activities and exhibitions by governmental organizations and NGOs.




